



Ganawendaasowin Post Majority Care Worker

Job Description

PURPOSE:

To empower youth and young adults transitioning from care by providing holistic supports that promote independence, well-being and lifelong success.

ACCOUNTABILITY:

The Ganawendaasowin Post Majority Care Worker will report directly to the Ganawendaasowin Supervisor and is responsible for the implementation of duties and responsibilities as outlined in the Job description.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Support the transition of youth and young adults to independent living by developing individualized plans and maintaining connections with family, extended family, and community supports.
- Identify and contact eligible current and former youth in care to provide information about and enroll them in the Post Majority Care Program.
- Deliver wrap-around, person-centered supports that promote the holistic well-being, independence, and long-term success of youth.
- Assist youth in accessing internal and external services, community resources, and cultural programming through appropriate referrals and ongoing support.
- Contribute to program planning, work plans, and service delivery improvements to enhance outcomes for youth and young adults.
- Maintain accurate, confidential, and up-to-date client files, records, and documentation in accordance with organizational policies and legislative requirements.
- Participate in mandatory training, professional development opportunities, cultural events, and other learning activities to support effective service delivery.
- Provide opportunities for genuine reconnection between youth and young adults to family, culture, and community; provide support that will encourage reunification or repatriation, as required.
- Assist youth in navigating government, health and social services.
- Perform additional duties and responsibilities as assigned to support departmental objectives and the overall success of the Post Majority Care Program.

PRIMARY QUALIFICATIONS

- Diploma/Degree in Social Work or related field.
- Excellent communication skills.
- Knowledge of Mitaanjigamiing First Nation cultural protocols.
- Experience supporting youth and young adults, including transition planning and case management.

SECONDARY QUALIFICATIONS

- Secondary School Diploma and/or experience in related field.
- Knowledge of the Ojibwe language is considered an asset.
- Knowledge of Weechee-it-te-win Family Services program.
- Knowledge of external agencies and services relating to youth.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- Must provide a Vulnerable Sector Screening that is satisfactory to the Mitaanjigamiing First Nation.
- Must have a valid Driver's License and access to a vehicle.
- Must sign Oath of Confidentiality, Declaration of Understanding, Conflict of Interest, Social Media Policy and Code of Conduct.
- Work evenings and weekends to meet the needs and times of all community members.
- Must possess valid First Aid/ CPR certification or be willing to obtain upon hire.
